2015-2016 Trends: ADAP

- **Coverage Trends**

- January 2015:

- States offering Expanded Coverage – 7 (CA, CO, HI, IA, MA, MN, NJ)
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 24

- June 2015:

- States offering Expanded Coverage – 11 (AZ, AR, CA, CO, HI, IA, LA, MA, MN, NJ, SD)
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 24

- January 2016:

- States offering Expanded Coverage – 17 (AZ, AR, CA, CO, DE, HI, IA, ME, MA, MN, NJ, OK, PA, TN, VA, WA, DC)
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 18

- June 2016:

- States offering Expanded Coverage – 26 (AZ, AR, CA, CO, DE, FL, GA, HI, IL, IA, LA, ME, MD, MA, MN, NE, NH, NJ, OK, PA, SD, TN, VA, WA, DC, PR)
 - States offering only Basic Coverage - 16

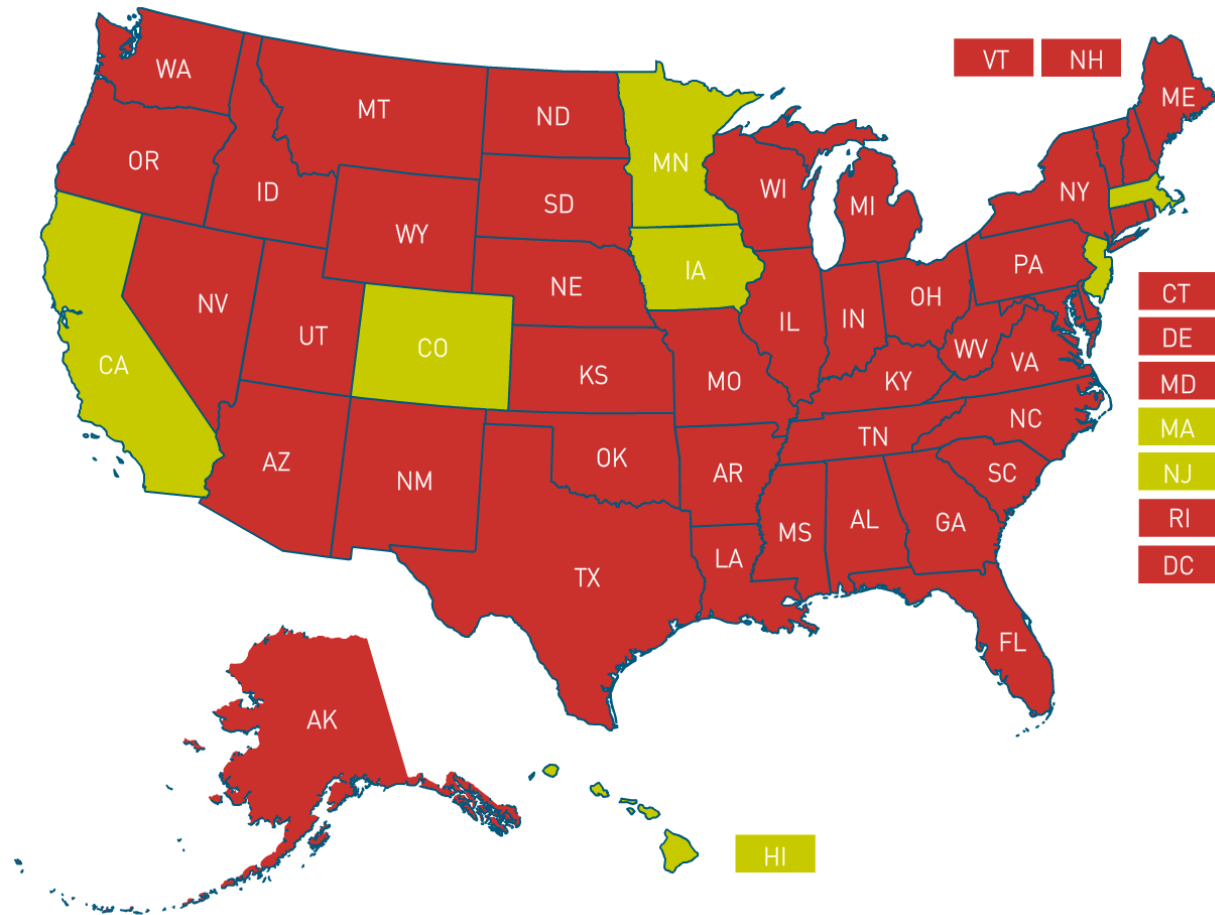
- August 2016:

- States offering Expanded Coverage – 27 (AZ, AR, CA, CO, DE, FL, GA, HI, IL, IA, LA, ME, MD, MA, MN, NE, NH, NJ, OK, OR, PA, SD, TN, VA, WA, DC, PR)
 - States offering only Basic Coverage - 15

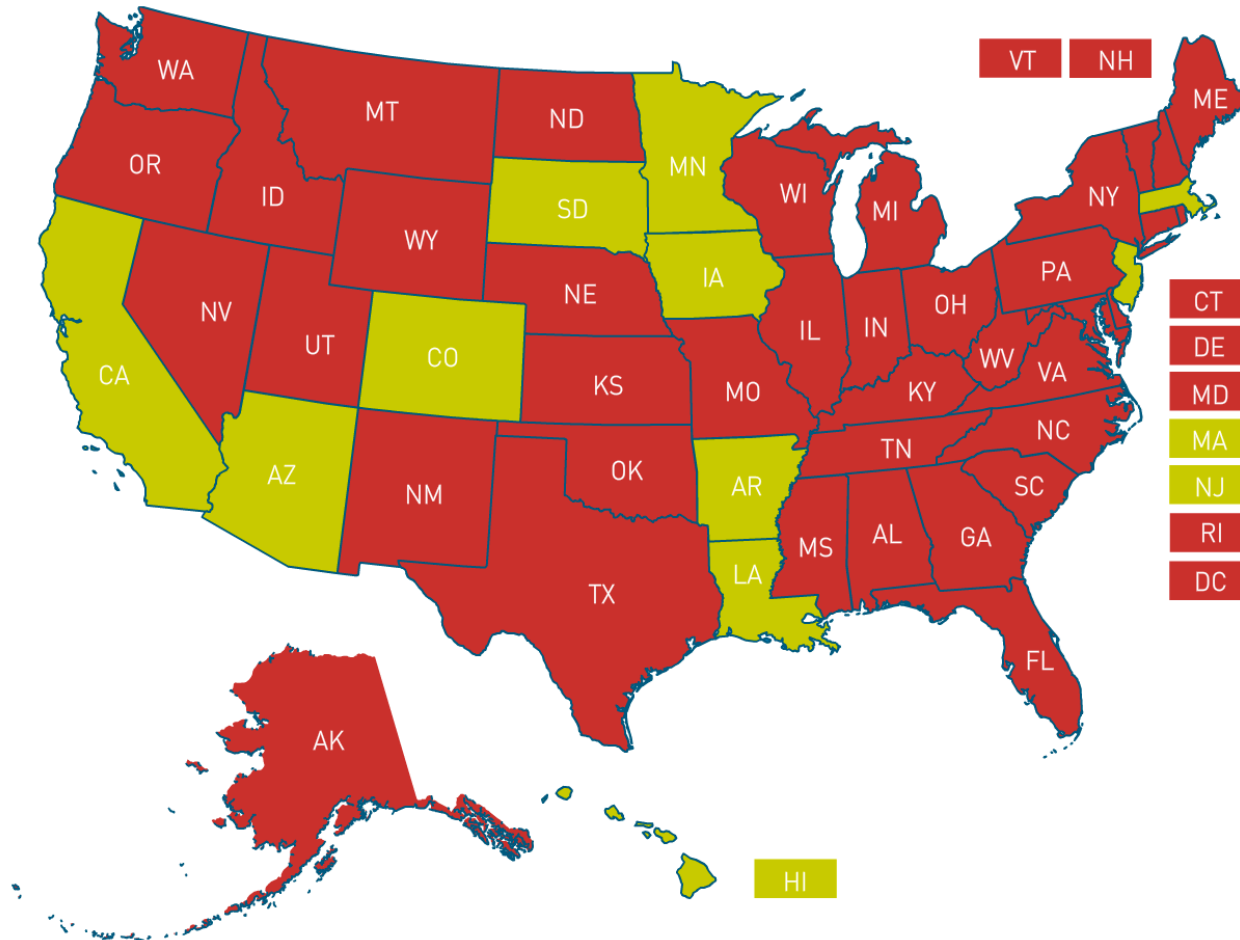
2015-2016 Trends: ADAP Con't.

- **Coverage Trends**
 - Coverage has expanded as more drugs become available
 - Zepatier had the highest initial adoption the first month it was available – 9 programs offered coverage;
 - Sovaldi, Harvoni, and Viekira Pak are the most covered drugs – 23, 24, & 21, respectively
 - Sovaldi's companion drug – Olysio – appears to be less favored than a Ribavirin combo
 - ADAP websites are often slow to update formulary information:
 - Alaska's site offers no formulary information
 - Arkansas' site has not updated their *posted* formulary since 2013
 - Kansas' site has not updated their formulary data since 2015
 - Missouri's site has not updated their formulary data since 2014
 - Rhode Island's site has not updated their formulary data since 2014

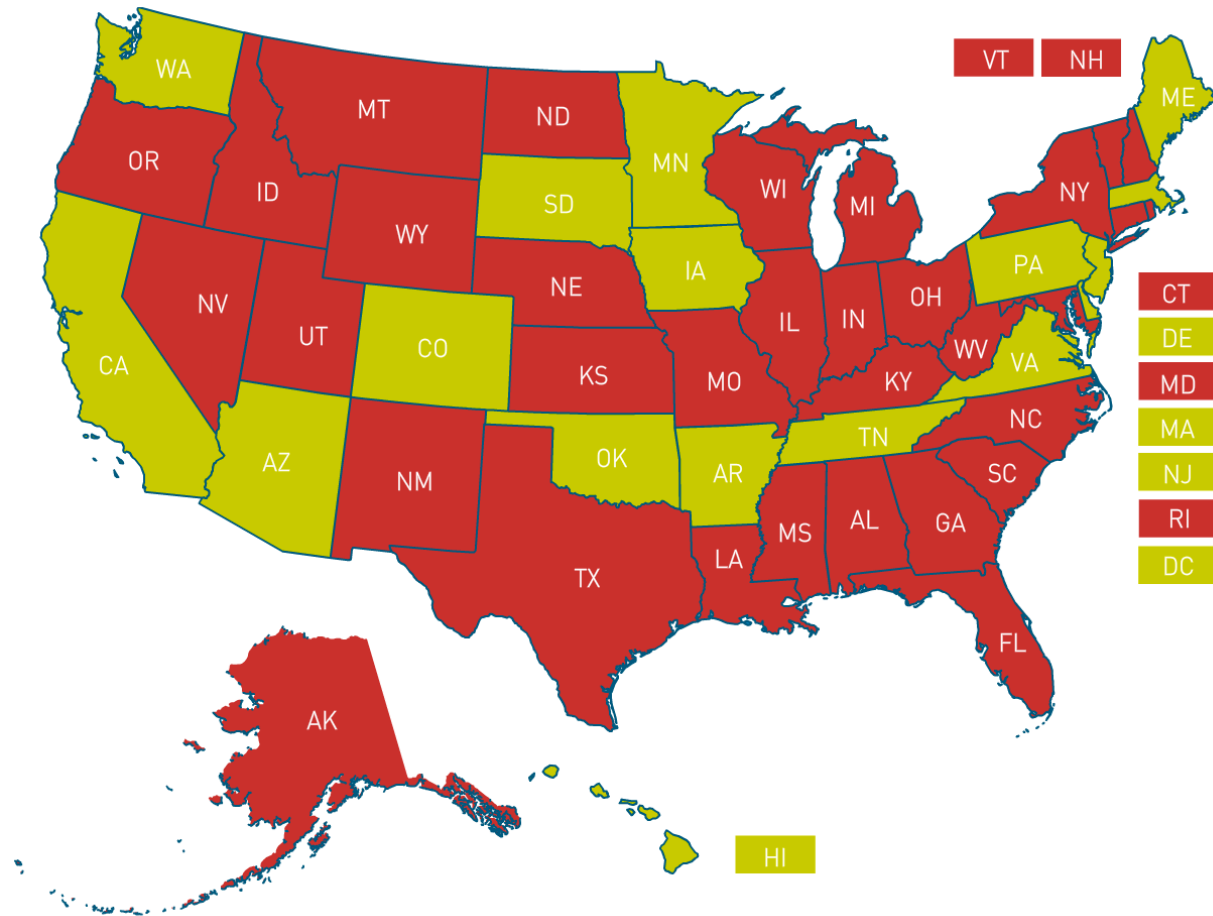
ADAP Expanded Coverage – January 2015



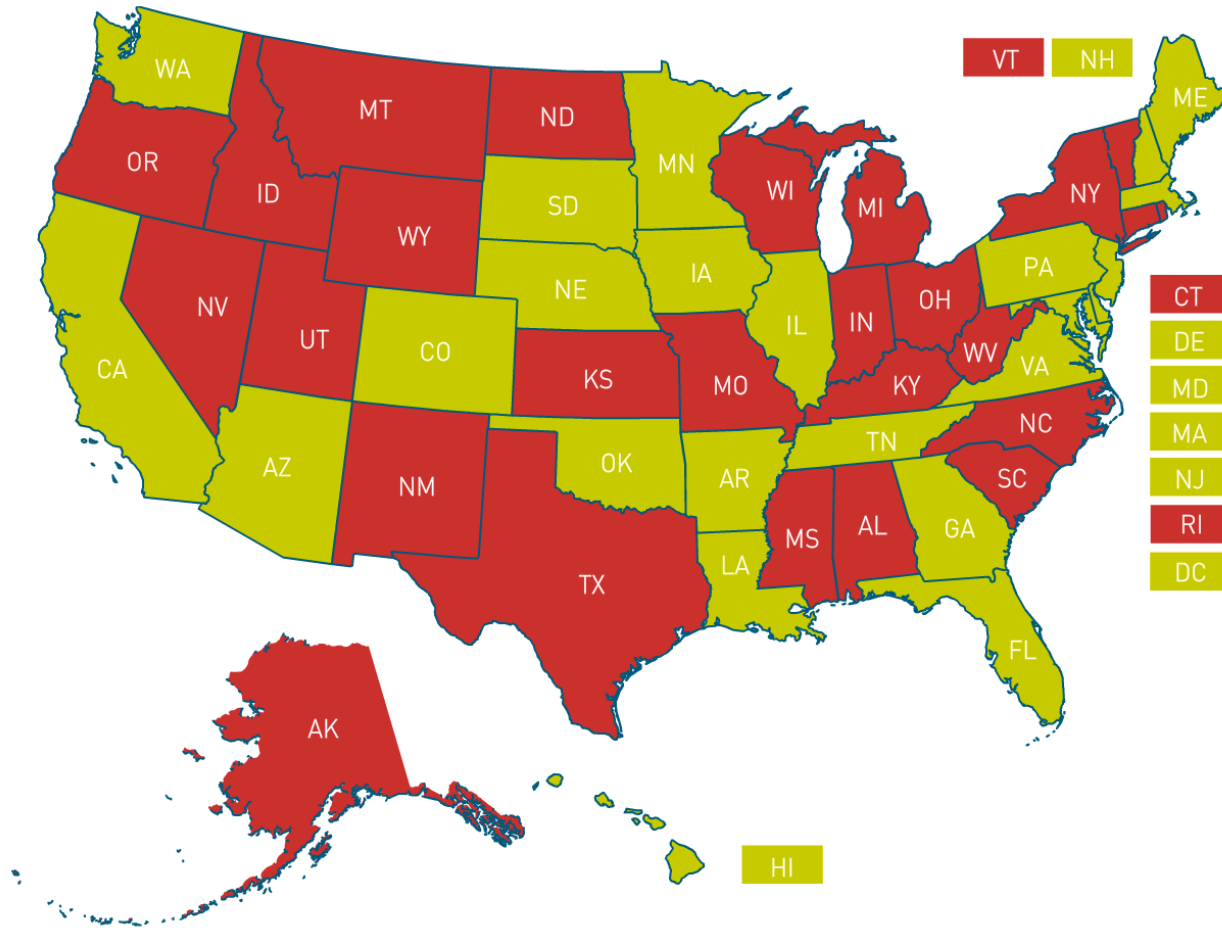
ADAP Expanded Coverage – June 2015



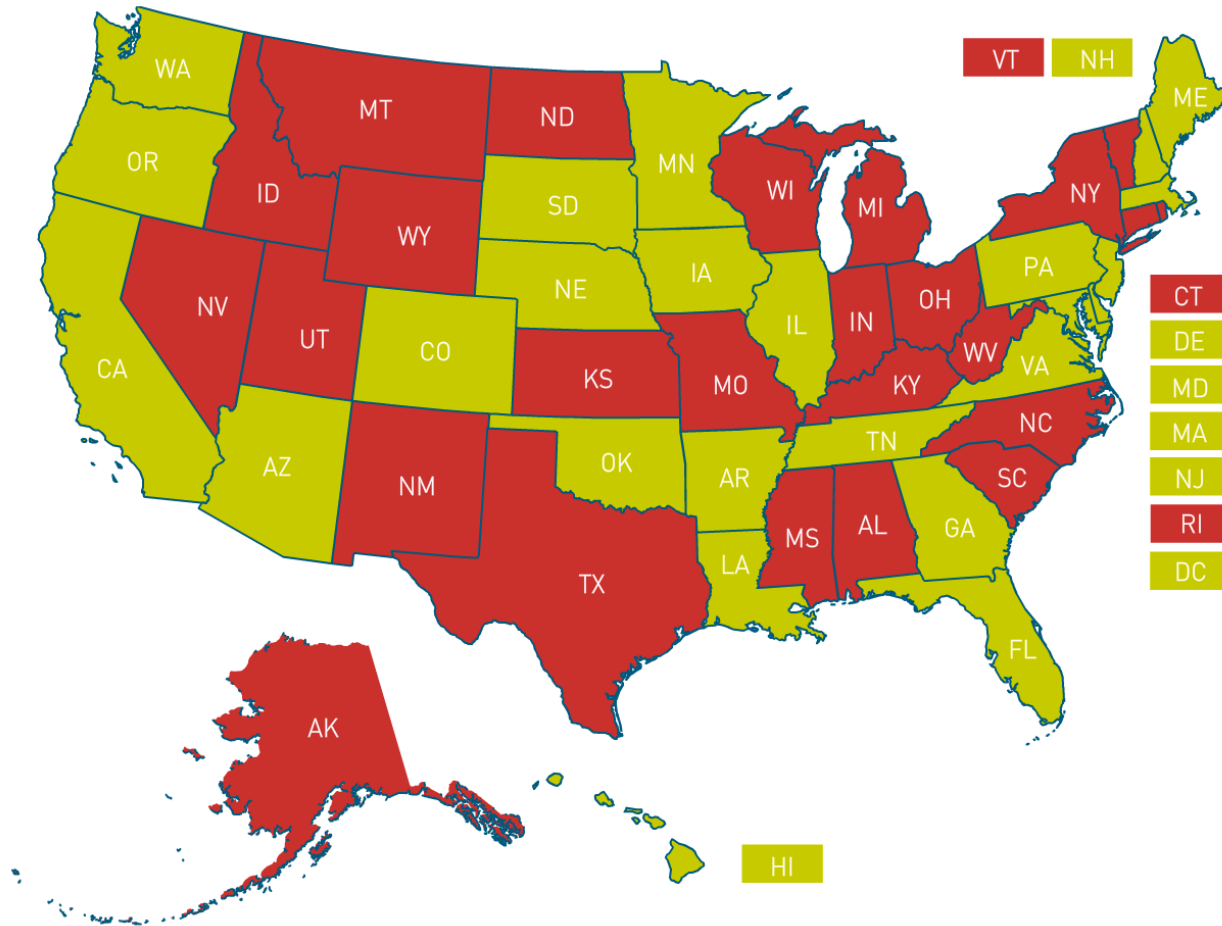

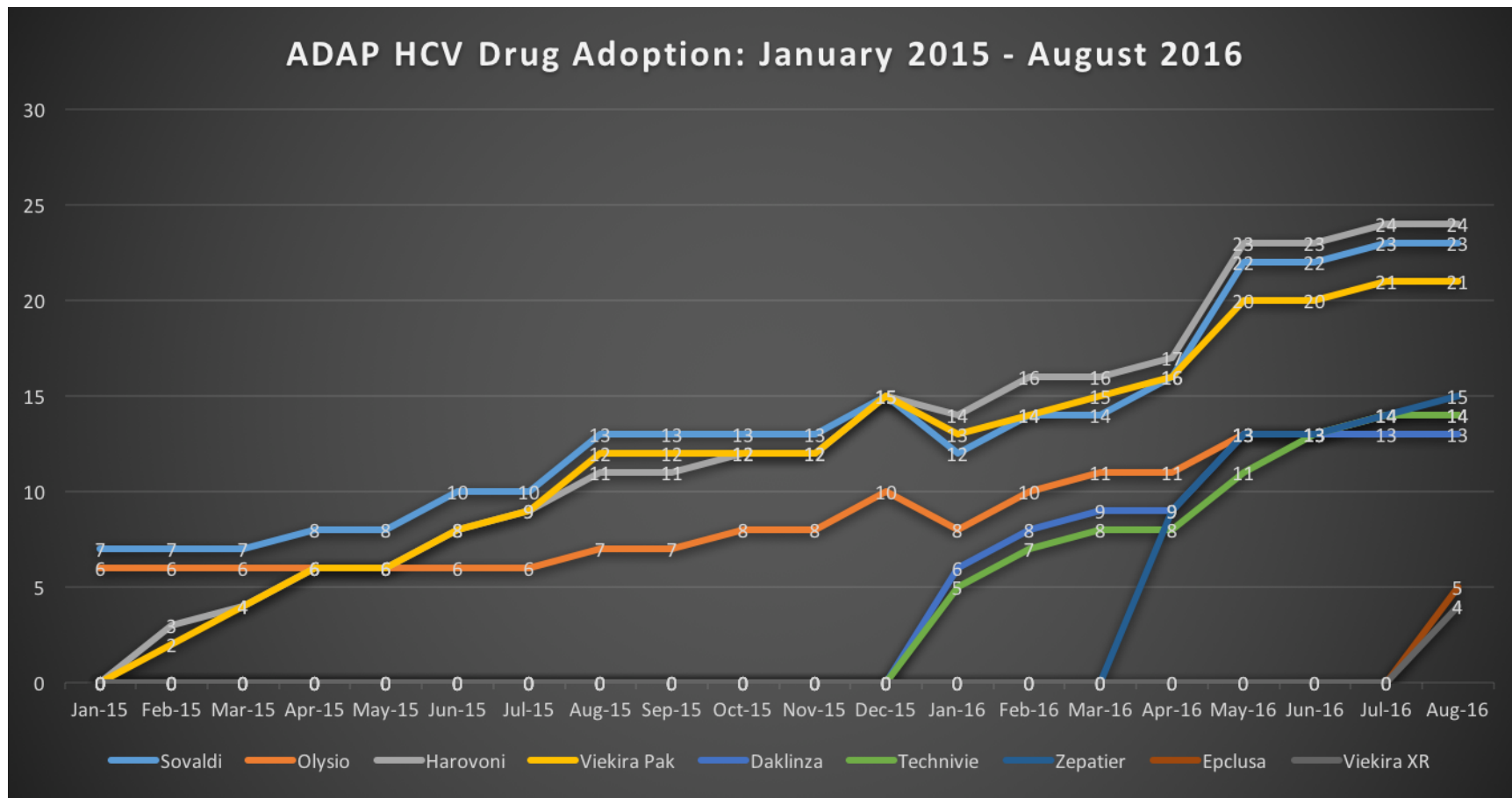
ADAP Expanded Coverage – June 2016

ADAP HCV Drug Utilization



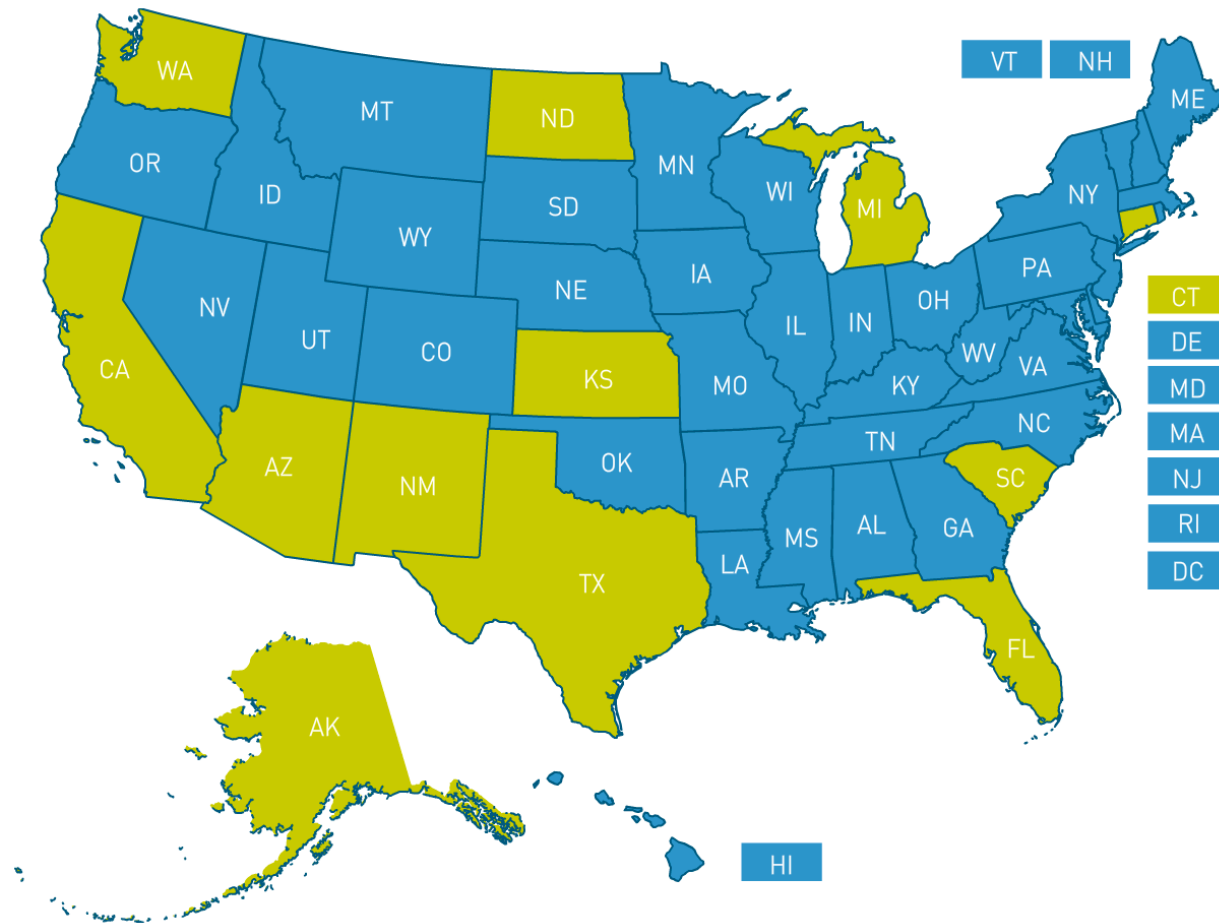
2015-2016 Trends: Medicaid

- **Coverage Trends**
 - January 2015:
 - States offering Expanded Coverage – 38
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 12 (AK, AR, CA, CT, FL, KS, MI, NM, ND, RI, SC, TX)
 - June 2015:
 - States offering Expanded Coverage – 39
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 11 (AR, CA, CT, FL, KS, MI, NM, ND, SC, TX, WA)
 - January 2016:
 - States offering Expanded Coverage – 49
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 2 (AR, MI)
 - June 2016:
 - States offering Expanded Coverage – 50
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 1 (AR)
 - August 2016:
 - States offering Expanded Coverage – 51
 - States offering only Basic Coverage – 0

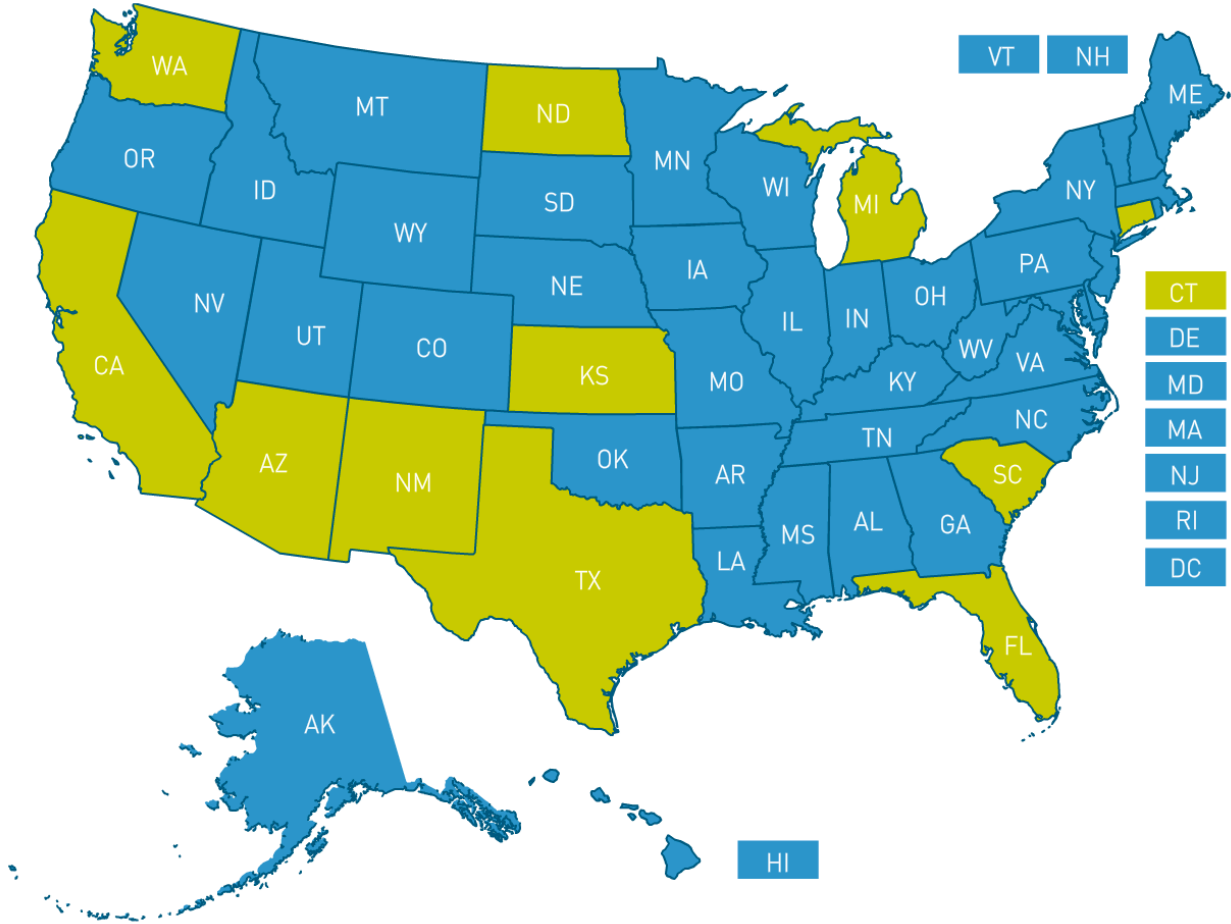
2015-2016 Trends: Medicaid Con't.

- **Coverage Trends**
 - All states currently offer Expanded Coverage for HCV drugs
 - Medicaid programs quicker to adopt HCV drugs than ADAPs
 - States with multiple coverage plans are likelier to have plans offering only one or two HCV DAAs
 - Alaska's Medicaid website has not posted updated PDL data since 2015

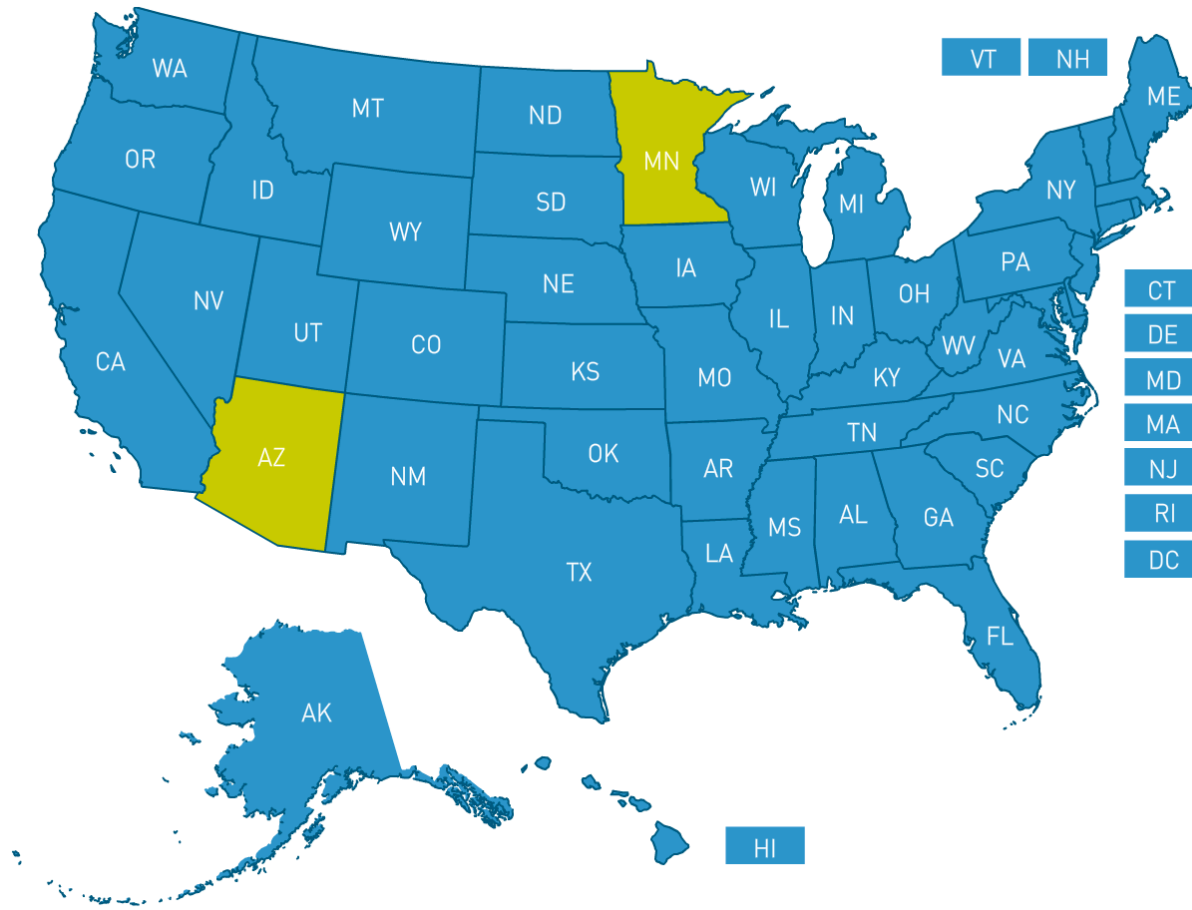
Medicaid Expanded Coverage – Jan. 2015



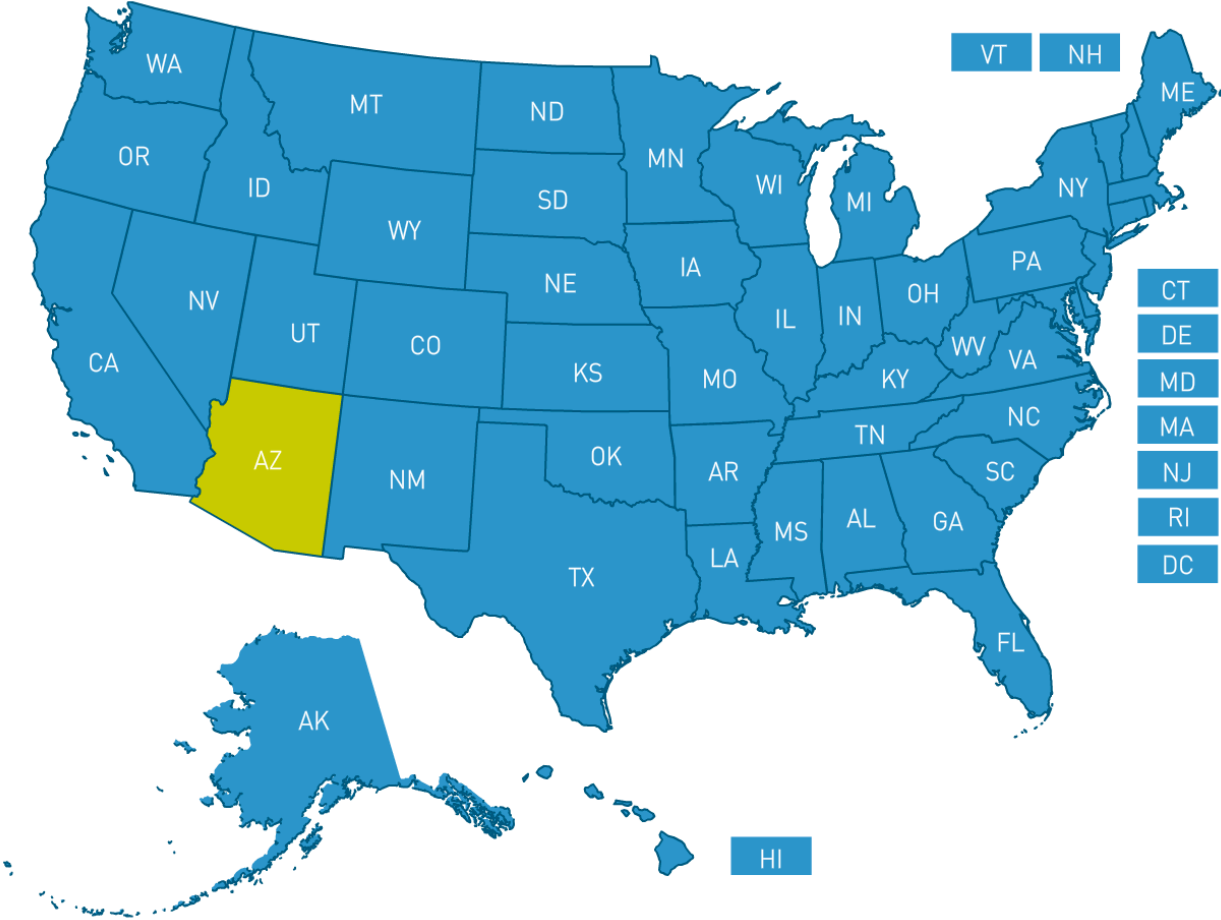
Medicaid Expanded Coverage – June 2015



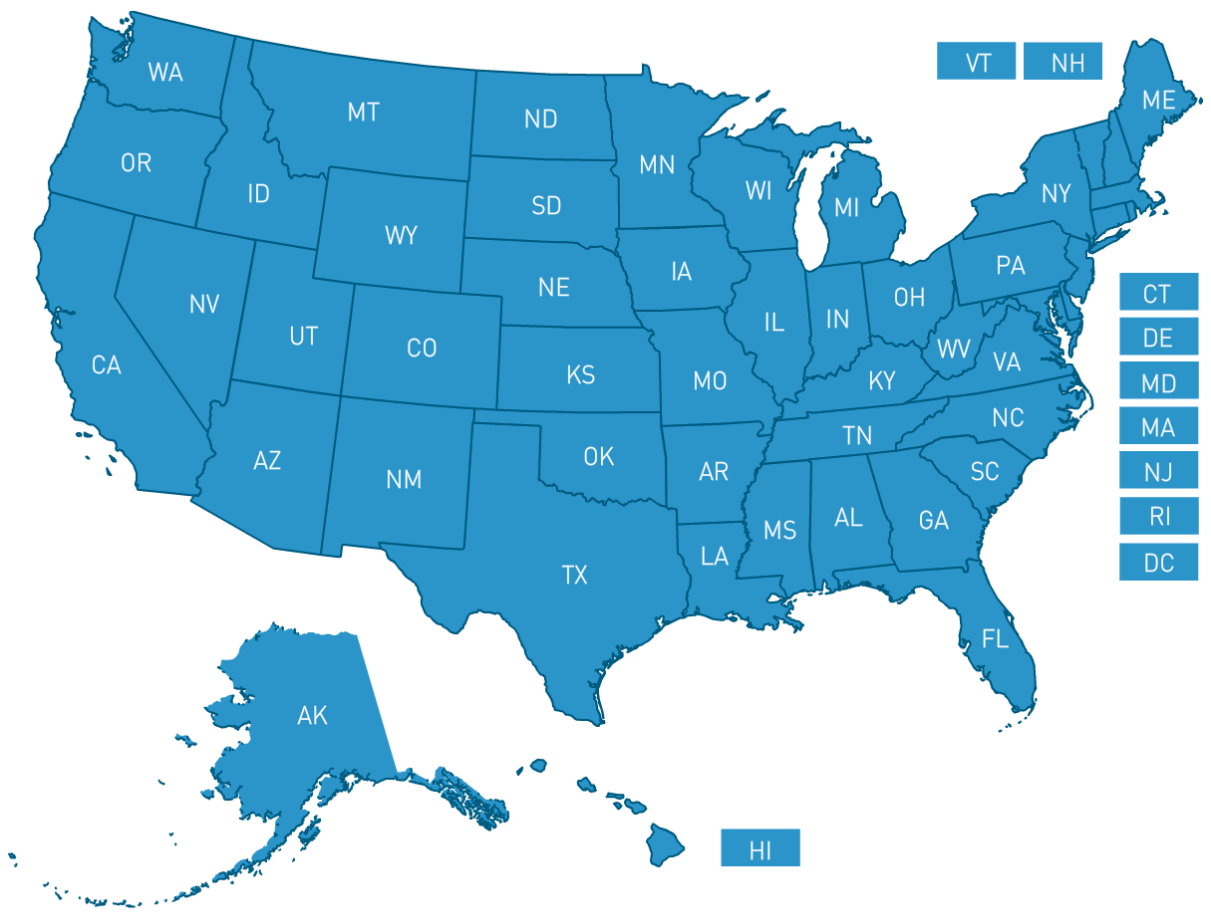
Medicaid Expanded Coverage – Jan. 2016



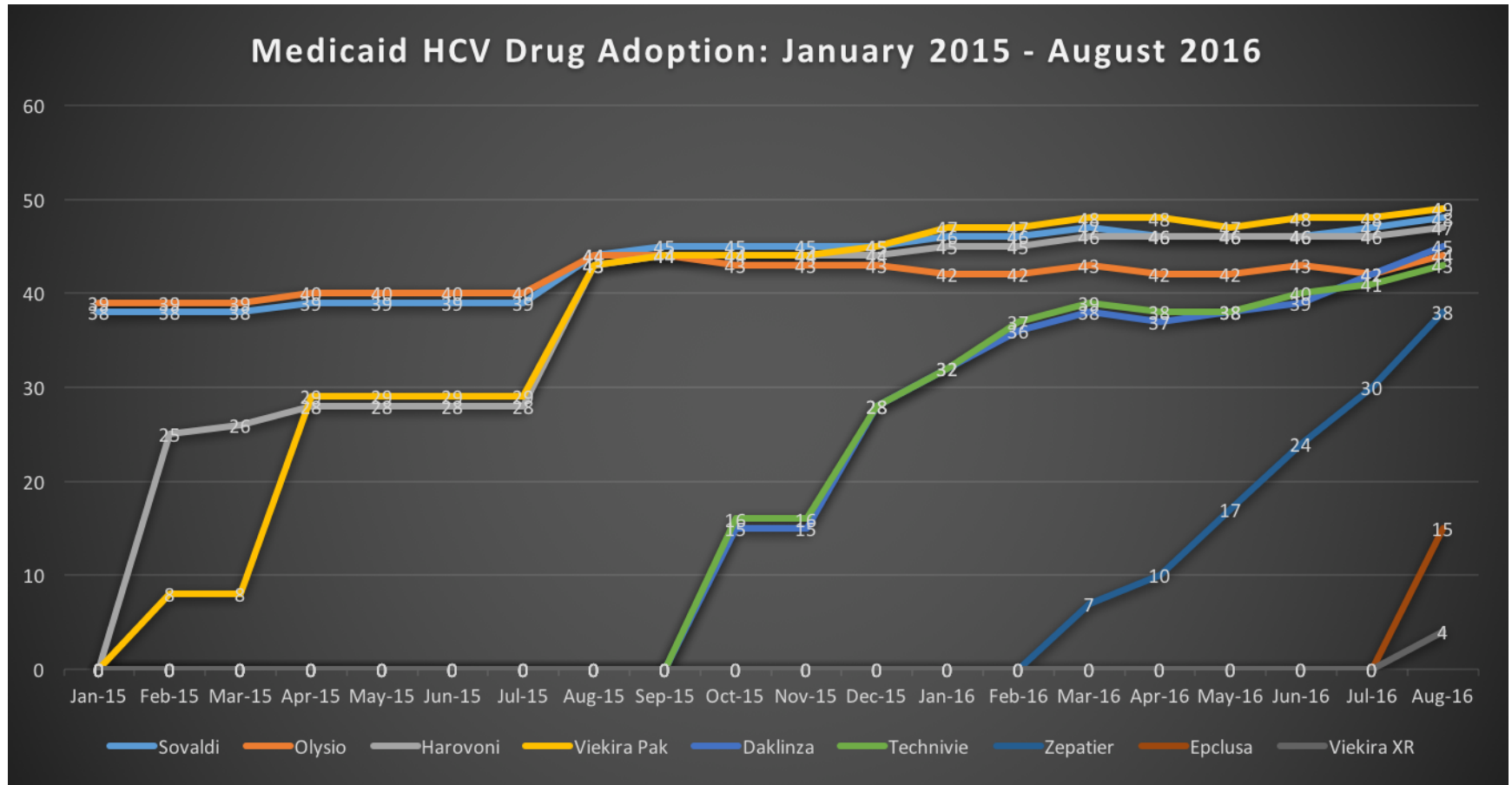
Medicaid Expanded Coverage – June 2016

Medicaid HCV Drug Utilization



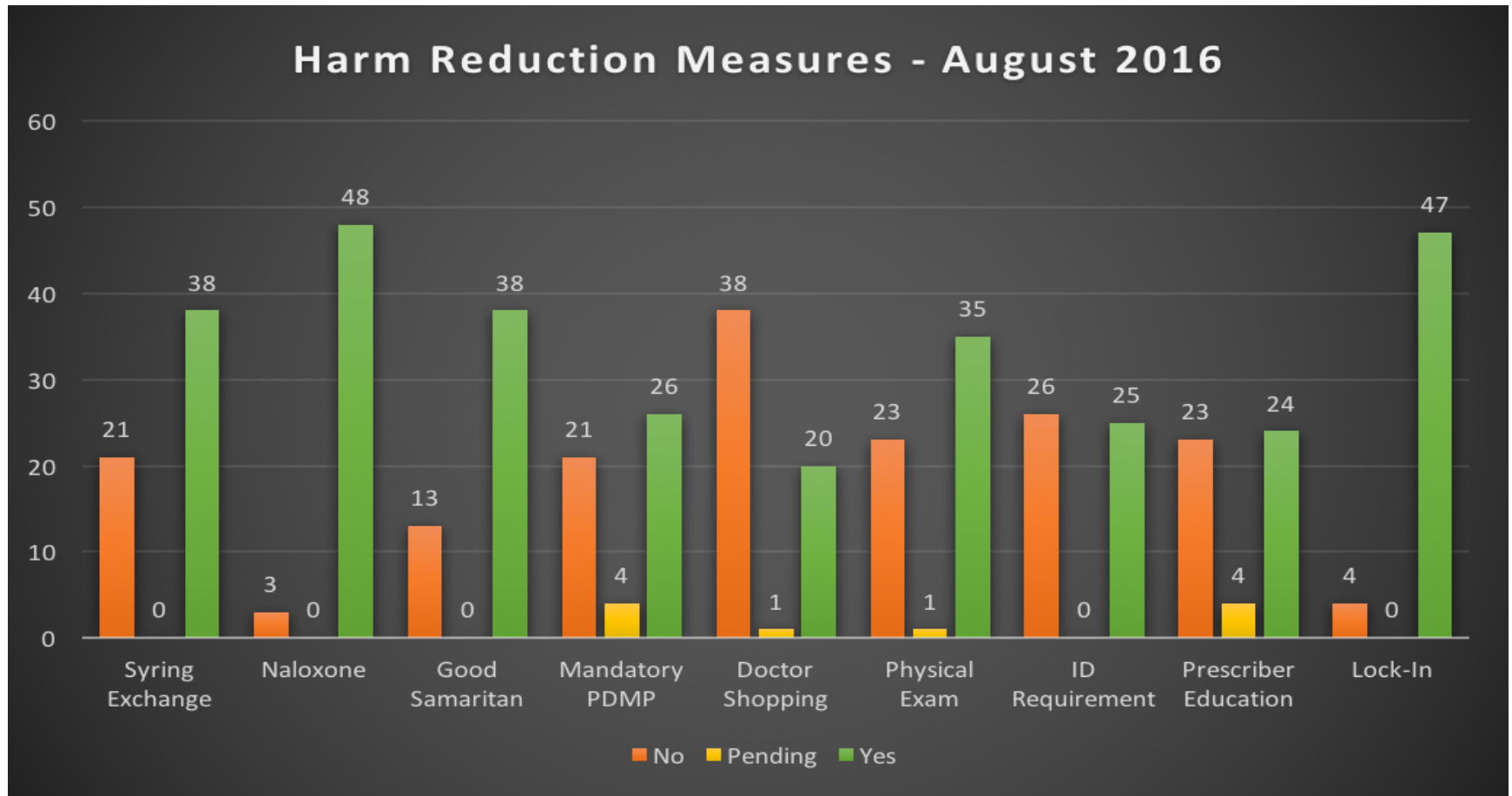
2016 Trends: Veterans Affairs

- **Coverage Trends:**
 - The Report began covering VA HCV coverage in March 2016
 - Coincided with VA announcement of universal coverage for all eligible VA members
 - The VA is quick to recommend off-label HCV regimens
 - Best Price requirement allows wider spread coverage for members
 - Treatment guidelines often recommend regimens using Ribavirin
 - Treatment guidelines often use only component drugs of multi-pill regimens

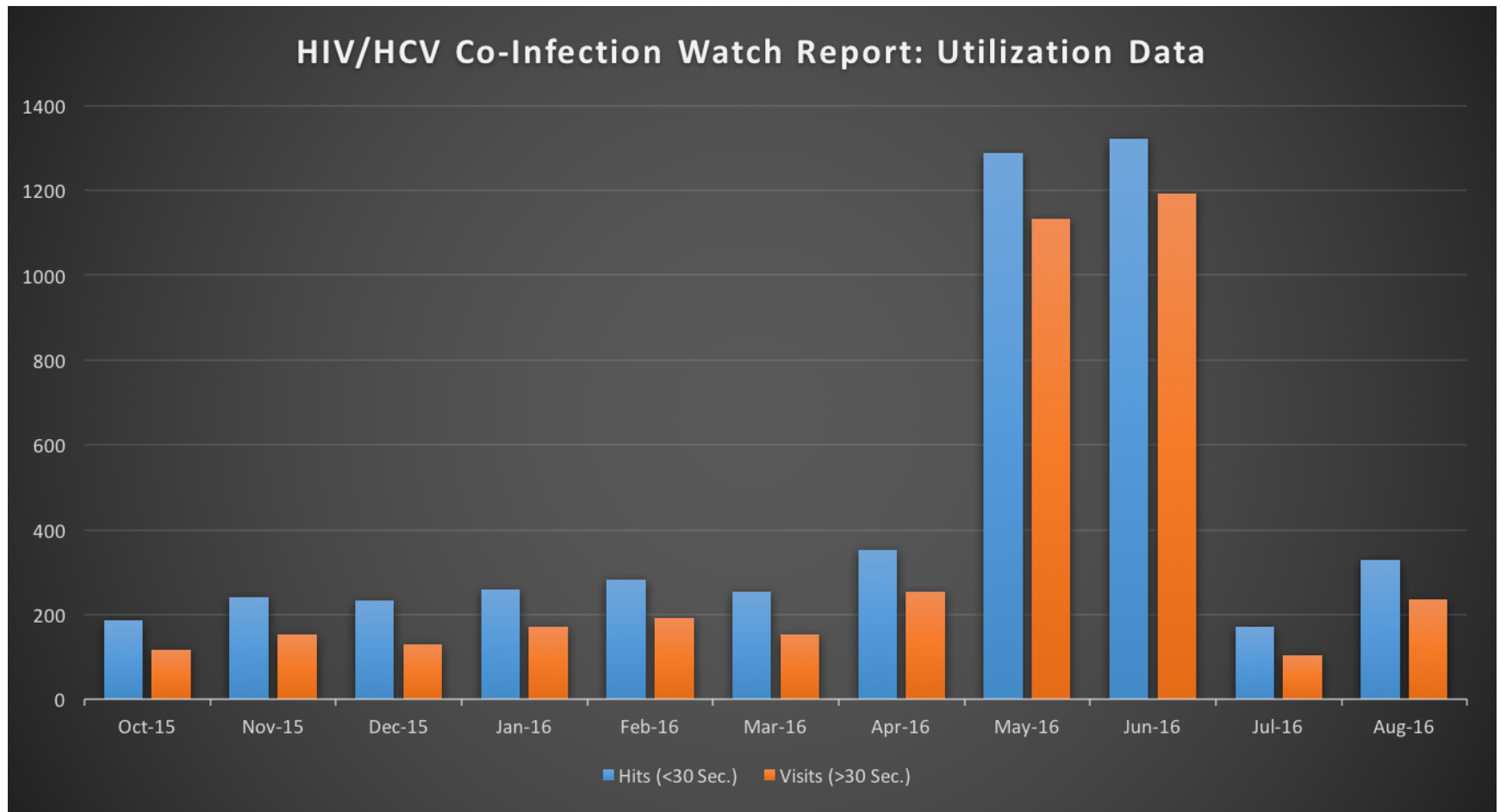
2016 Trends: Harm Reduction

- Legislative Trends
 - Most states with pending Harm Reduction legislation are considering Mandatory PDMPs and Lock-In measures
 - Kansas has enacted none of the nine Harm Reduction measures tracked by the Report
 - North Carolina is currently the only state that has enacted all nine measures
 - Doctor Shopping laws are the least enacted measure
 - Expanded Naloxone Access and Lock-In programs are the most enacted measures – 48 & 47, respectively
