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Community Access National Network Launches Digital Microsite for its Flagship Program, HIV/HCV Co-Infection Watch

Patient education program enters its sixth year

WASHINGTON, DC (January 12, 2021) – The Community Access National Network, otherwise known as CANN, today announced that it has launched a digital microsite to house its HIV/HCV Co-Infection Watch. The flagship program now enters its sixth year offering a patient-centric informational portal serving three primary groups – patients, healthcare providers, and AIDS Service Organizations.

"People living with HIV-infection face a higher risk of long-term liver failure as a result of co-infection with Hepatitis C," summarized William E. Arnold, President & CEO of the Community Access National Network. "In fact, HCV-related liver failure has become the leading non-AIDS-related cause of death among people living with HIV-infection in the United States – and as such, treating HCV is of paramount importance."

The HIV/HCV Co-Infection Watch focuses on the intersection between coinfection of HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis C, through the collective lenses of the State AIDS Drug Assistance Programs, State Medicaid Programs, Veterans Affairs Programs, Patient Assistance Programs, and Harm Reduction Programs
