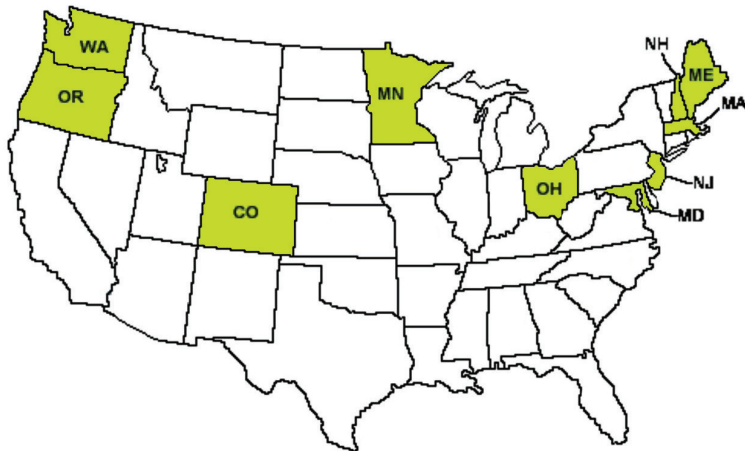


Drug Pricing Advisory Boards: What They Are and Why They Matter to Patients

DPAB States: CO, MA, ME, MD, MN, NH, NJ, OH, OR, WA

Healthcare Spending in the United States

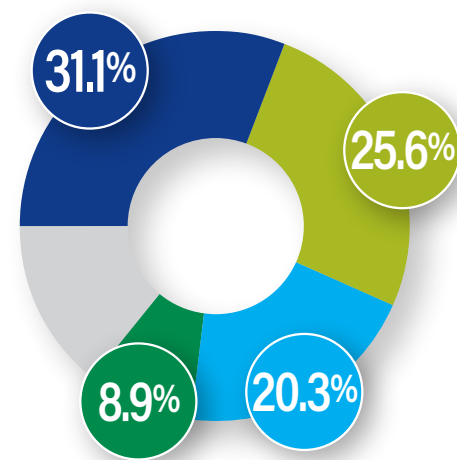
4.3 trillion dollars

Total National Health Expenditure In 2021
(with an increased of **2.7%** from previous year)

The federal government held the majority of the spending burden **34%**

More than 15% of adults in the United States report past-due medical debt

Nearly 73% owing some or all of that debt to hospitals.

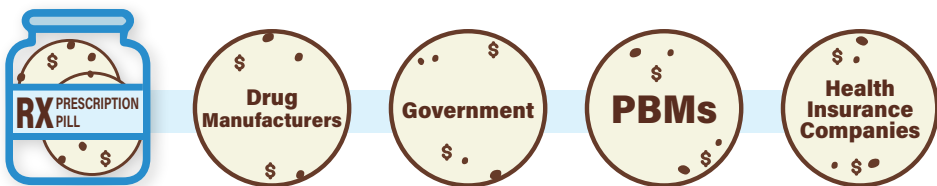


Total National Health Expenditures
