Community Access National Network ANNUAL REPORT – 2016

The Community Access National Network (CANN) is a 501(c)(3) national nonprofit organization (formerly incorporated under the "Ryan White CARE Act Title II Community AIDS National Network") focusing on public policy issues relating to HIV/AIDS and Viral Hepatitis. CANN's mission is to define, promote, and improve access to healthcare services and supports for people living with HIV/AIDS and/or Viral Hepatitis through advocacy, education, and networking. CANN's coalition-based work is done on behalf of the patient advocacy groups, pharmaceutical partners, and government agencies.

CANN's programmatic projects include:

- National ADAP Working Group, or NAWG
- Hepatitis: Education, Advocacy, and Leadership, or HEAL
- HIV/HCV Co-Infection Watch
- Medicaid Watch

National ADAP Working Group (NAWG)

NAWG brings members of the HIV/AIDS community and industry together to engage in conversation about the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP). This format was and still is extremely progressive since it takes into account all of the many different stakeholders to create a comprehensive view of the program and funding.

In 2016, NAWG published twelve (12) news distributions, including information and updates on issues relevant to ADAP.

Additionally, NAWG co-hosted the following events in partnership with the ADAP Advocacy Association:

• AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) Regional Summit in Birmingham, Alabama.

Hepatitis: Education, Advocacy & Leadership (HEAL)

HEAL raises awareness about Viral Hepatitis, and also educates consumers, community partners, and policy-makers about the fastest growing public health epidemic since AIDS: <u>HCV infection</u>.

Community Access National Network (CANN) www.tiicann.org In 2016, HEAL periodically hosted stakeholder meetings to discuss emerging issues. It published twelve (12) news distributions, including newsworthy articles on the latest testing, treatment, advocacy, and policy news. HIV/HCV Co-Infection Watch

The HIV/HCV Co-Infection Watch is as a patient-centric informational portal serving three primary groups – patients, healthcare providers, and AIDS Service Organizations.

HCV infection is the most common chronic blood borne infection in the United States; approximately 3.2 million persons are chronically infected. Approximately 12,000 people die every year from HCV-related liver disease. The number of HCV-related deaths per year has outnumbered those dying from AIDS. It is estimated 200,000-300,000 people in the United States are co-infected with both HIV and HCV infections. Experts believe that about 25% of Americans with HIV also have HCV; conversely some 10% of people with HCV are thought to also have HIV. Without information, and access to comprehensive medical treatment, patients living with HIV and HCV infections are likely to progress to complicated liver diseases, such as cirrhosis of the liver, ultimately leading to liver failure and early death.


Medicaid Watch



ADAP Expanded Coverage – January 2015


ADAP Expanded Coverage – January 2016




ADAP Expanded Coverage - June 2015



ADAP Expanded Coverage – June 2016



Medicaid Expanded Coverage - January 2015


Medicaid Expanded Coverage – January 2016




Medicaid Expanded Coverage – June 2015
